

## THE SUESS CONNECTION

### Three Generations of One Family in Phi Psi

"You have to be odd to be number one," said Dr. Seuss, the famous children's author. There are not one, but five Suess family members that call themselves Phi Psi's from Oklahoma Alpha. The spelling is similar, but the Suess brothers will bristle with the comparative reference to the author.

As legacies go, the Suess connection is a great one. It spans the 50's, 80's, 90's and 2020's. Beginning with T. John Suess Buffalo '52, the patriarch of the family, followed by his sons John P. Suess Oklahoma '84, Jim B. Suess Oklahoma '86, Jeff M. D. Suess Oklahoma '87, and Josh W. Suess Oklahoma '89. With the newest addition, his grandson, Jonathan Suess Oklahoma '21, the legacy has added another generation.

It was a happy surprise to their father when John was initiated into the brotherhood in 1984 followed closely by Jim in 1986. Jim remembers fondly that his "dad loved coming to the house and I loved having him there. Dad loved hanging out talking to the guys with a beer in his hand." When it came time for Josh to accept his bid in 1989, he recalls joining Phi Psi was "automatic because it was a family tradition."

The candle that was lit in 1952 is still burning; A young boy who attended tailgates with his family as a child is now an adult, as well as member of Phi Kappa Psi - Jonathan Suess Oklahoma '21. The son of Jeff and grandson of T. John Suess, Jon was gifted his grandfather's badge and holds that close to heart alongside the stories he heard from his family before joining, alongside his own he has now created.

Some of the Suess family's warmest memories from their collegiate years were when they were with their brothers, both familial and fraternal. Whether it was gamedays or social events, spending time with the Brotherhood, with their family, was paramount in their undergraduate experience. Jim and Josh both stay in touch with their Phi Psi brothers to this day, continuing the connection of brotherhood throughout their lives.

Now that the older siblings have moved away, pursuing their careers and with families of their own, we can hope that their Phi Psi family legacy will continue to live on through generations to come. Perhaps we can make the Suess family legacy required pledge learning. For if we do, the Suess' will say, "Today I shall behave as if this is the day I will be remembered."

**NEWS FROM OKLAHOMA ALPHA****CARRY IT FORWARD CAMPAIGN**

In 1969, Phi Kappa Psi undergraduate brothers came up with the idea of running the football from Norman to Columbia, Missouri for the highly anticipated then Big 8 matchup. The 450-mile trek through 3 states was a new unofficial world record for farthest handoff of a football. Sooner Coach Fairbanks came to the Chapter House at 720 Elm, where he autographed the football at the start of the run.

Sign-up sheets were organized for runners who would go four to five in a car, and rotate the runners while the car would follow the runner carrying the ball. A majority of the approximately 70 members at the time signed up for at least one turn to advance the ball to Columbia. Day and night, they kept advancing the ball, until they delivered it Saturday on the field of play.

That spirit lives on and the meaning of "Carry It Forward" is the essence of our newest capital campaign to raise \$1 million over the next 3 years. Donations will help us continue to build on our vision of the future and carry forward the Phi Psi experience to the next generations.
